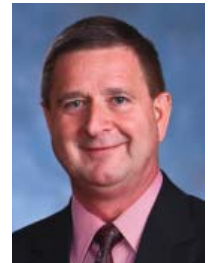

Camps and clinics, conditioning programs, open gym, summer leagues, use of school facilities, use of school equipment and the allowable use of student fundraising moneys are all included in the above mentioned section and are established to provide opportunities to help students improve their skills, but also to moderate the amount of time and involvement of sponsors and coaches in these activities.

As the summer proceeds, keep in mind what helps student athletes and activity participants to be successful in the next school year and remember that keeping a fresh, positive and encouraging outlook toward the next school year will do a great deal to provide student athletes and activity participants the potential for success.

The Nebraska School Activities Association encourages schools to call the office and speak with any of the Directors with questions regarding what are appropriate and allowable summertime student activities. From all of us at the NSAA, best wishes for the kind of summer that allows you and your students to “hit the ground running” with a fresh and rejuvenated spirit for success in the 2011-12 school year.

COMMITTEE ON SPEECH AND PLAY PRODUCTION

Minutes of June 1, 2011 Meeting

The Committee on Speech and Play Production met on Wednesday, June 1, 2011, at 8:00 a.m. at the NSAA Office. Debra Velder, Associate Director of the NSAA, chaired the meeting. The mission of the committee was to develop the 2011-12 Speech and Play Production judge's exam, review the Judge's Manual, and discuss possible changes in Class A speech sections at State Speech; selection criteria for judges for district and state speech and play production; a tie-breaking procedure when determining the finalist at state speech; and NET coverage of speech and play production.

Committee members present were Patsy Koch-Johns, Lincoln High School; Matt Davis, Lincoln East High School; Matt Heimes, Lincoln Southwest High School; Mel Shoemaker, Kearney High School; Cathy English, Aurora High School; Taryn Ratzlaff, Auburn High School; A.J. Johnson, Hartington High School; Candice Cain, Burwell High School; Gayle Smith, Alma High School; and Kathy Larson, Potter-Dix High School. Ex-officio members included NSAA staff members Debra Velder and Cindy Callaway.

The committee formulated questions for the 2011-12 Speech and Play Production judge's exam. The committee spent a considerable amount of time on the use of electronic devices (i.e. Kindle, Ipad) as a manuscript in events, specifically Persuasive Speaking. It was the committee's interpretation that at this point, until future study, the manuscript, if requested, would need to be in paper form. Judges will be instructed to address the audience prior to each round to turn off all electronic devices, including their own. In compliance with the Duet Acting rules, using more than 2 chairs and a table will result in a disqualification.

2011 MUSIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES

The 2011 Nebraska School Activities Association (NSAA) Music Advisory Committee met on May 23, 2011, at the NSAA offices in Lincoln, Nebraska, with five music coordinators present:

- District I - Jim Kucera, Waverly Public Schools
- District II - Doran Johnson, Omaha Westside High School

NSAA Assistant Director Bud Dahlstrom called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

The purpose of this 2011 NSAA District Music Coordinators Committee meeting was to evaluate the District Music Contests that were held April 14-16, 18-20, 2011 and to plan for the 2012 Contests. Reports and discussion on the District Music Contests comprised most of the meeting.

The following were the major items that were reported on and discussed:

1. Reports from each of the NSAA District Music Coordinators:

A. Overview of District Music Contests at each site:

1. Each of the District Coordinators reported that the 2011 District Music Contests went well and expressed their appreciation to the contest hosts.
2. District I reported that the new process implemented for hiring and contracting judges for this year's contests was very effective and eliminated the late hiring of judges and helped keep contest expenses down.
3. District II had less participation at some class sites due to a split in high schools, the contest dates falling before spring break for some schools and the transfer of four schools to another district due to the Nebraska Department of Education moving the date for the annual Skills USA conference from March to April.
4. District III submitted a report for next year's contest sites, directors and dates.
5. District IV reported that one event had to be postponed on April 15 due to a snowstorm and was rescheduled and held the following week.
6. District IV is encouraging their site hosts to contract different judges on a two-year rotational basis.
7. District IV reported that the Class AA, A, and B site in Grand Island would not host contest next year unless they could pick a date outside the six days designated on the NSAA calendar for holding district music contests.
8. District V expenses were lower this year and within the budget forecast by the district managing committee for their three contest sites.
9. District V reported that the contest site in the west, hosted for many years in McCook, would be moved in 2012 to Chase County High School and a three-year rotation is being planned for contest hosts beginning next year.
10. District VI reported that music contest went well in Scottsbluff and that Chadron State College would not be hosting the other District VI contest site next year. A search is underway to find another host school for this event.

B. Number of schools and individuals participating at each site:

1. There was a slight decrease in the number of schools and students participating at District Music Contests this year with 299 schools and 21,689 students attending 25 contest sites.
2. There was discussion on ways to prevent the scheduling of athletic events which conflict with district music contest dates established on the NSAA calendar and have a negative impact on participation and attendance for these events. It was agreed that making information about contest week available as soon as possible for school program administrators was a good practice to avoid the scheduling or rescheduling of conflicting events during that time. The music contest dates for four years in advance are shown on the annual NSAA desk calendar which is sent to all schools and the on-line NSAA Music Manual.

C. District Contest entry fees at each site—late fees, expenses/receipts, future adjustments:

1. Each district coordinator reviewed their sites contest fees. Five of the six districts reported balanced or surplus revenue budgets for their events with one reporting a deficit. An adjustment to the receipt totals in District VI will be made for this year's contest financial report.
2. Five schools intending to attend music contest missed the March 20 entry deadline but attended by meeting the provisions of the NSAA Approved Ruling for late contest entries.

D. Other items for discussion from each of the districts:

1. Updated adjudicator ballots for Large and Small Ensembles were examined and approved by the committee for use beginning in 2012 and will be posted on the NSAA website this summer. These are modifications which do not change the basic structure, scoring formulas or rating scale of the present ballots but which do provide more specific guidance for each ensemble's performance caption on the ballot.
2. The 'NSAA Outstanding Performance/Honorable Mention Award' program for soloists and small ensembles developed to recognize the top performers at NSAA District Music Contests was reviewed. The awards were presented to the top performers from each contest site performance center (adjudicator's room), regardless of class or type of vocal or instrumental performance in the solo or small ensemble categories. The necessary adjudicator forms, tracking documents and award certificate logistical details were discussed and clarifications decided on for providing the certificates and tracking the award recipient details.
4. A change of interpretation was discussed for non-coed high schools' large vocal ensemble entries known as a "Mixed Chorus" (performance time limit-18 minutes); to be allowed to consider their designated "Mixed Chorus" to be made up of same gender students with the same maximum time limit. This interpretation was approved by the committee and will be noted in next year's music manual.
5. An opportunity was presented for music contest student performances on statewide television beginning in 2012 or 2013. A selection process for students achieving the NSAA Outstanding Performance Award was developed and included solo and small ensemble performances from students representing all six NSAA districts. No formal action was taken by the committee regarding this opportunity.

2. Planning for 2012 NSAA District Music Contests was discussed with emphasis on securing host sites and Directors for all of the contests.

A. Dates for the 2012 NSAA District Music Contests will be April 16-21.

B. All sites for 2012 District Music Contests have been secured with the exception of the AA, A, B, C site in Districts IV and VI.

3. Discussion on any changes that need to be made to the NSAA Music Manual and the NSAA District Music Contest online entry form:

The committee discussed the addition of clarifying sections in the Points of Emphasis information found under the Scores section of the 2012 NSAA Music Manual to include required documentation for judges presented with downloaded and/or photocopied music which is in the public domain. This unprotected music is available from various sources without charge and can be used at district music contest providing the proper documentation is attached to the judges' music.

4. 2011-2012 NSAA Music Proposals:

Music proposals for the 2011-2012 school year were discussed.

A. A proposal for next year's NSAA legislative process was discussed and approved for increasing the performance maximum time limit for Percussion Ensemble entries from six minutes to 10 minutes to allow four additional minutes for equipment set-up and removal.

Appreciation was expressed on behalf of the NSAA office and association membership for the outstanding work provided by members of the Music Advisory Committee during the past year.

The next meeting of the NSAA District Music Advisory Committee has been set for May 21, 2012 at the NSAA office in Lincoln, Nebraska.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:30 a.m.

and Vitoria Wiese, Lindsay Holy Family.

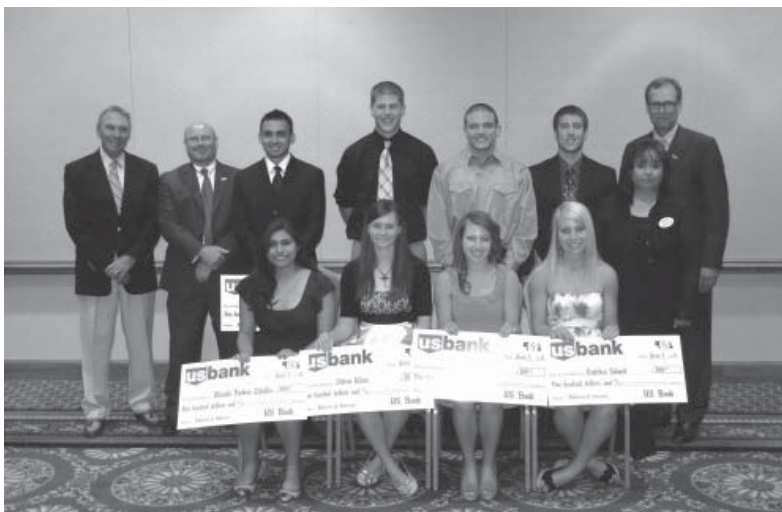

Ron Higdon to Join NSAA Staff as Assistant Director

The Nebraska School Activities Association (NSAA) has hired former University of Nebraska-Omaha associate head wrestling coach Rod Higdon as an assistant director.

Higdon, who will start July 1, replaces Darin Boysen, who is leaving the NSAA to become the executive director of the Nebraska Coaches Association.

Higdon will be in charge of wrestling. He will head up the NSAA's weight management program, run the NSAA Wrestling Championships, and be charged with coordinating the NSAA Dual Wrestling Tournament. The NSAA Representative Assembly passed a proposal at its April meeting to extend the wrestling season one week so that a dual-format event can be added to the NSAA's championship slate.

"We are very lucky to have someone like Ron Higdon join our staff," says NSAA interim executive director Steve Shanahan. "He is well-respected across this state. Ron has tremendous knowledge of wrestling, and he also has extensive experience in event management, which will be very beneficial for

the Association."

Higdon, who earned his bachelor's and master's degrees from UNO, was the athletic facilities director for the Mavericks from 2002 to 2010. Part of his duties included coordinating event operations at the Sapp Fieldhouse and Al Caniglia Stadium.

"I am really excited to stay with wrestling," says Higdon, who was as surprised as anyone when the Nebraska-Omaha administration announced it was eliminating wrestling the day after the Mavericks won their sixth Division II national championship in eight years last March.

UNO, which hosted the NCAA Division II Wrestling Championships several times, appointed Higdon to serve as the tournament's co-director in 1999, 2005 and 2010 when the championships were held at the Sapp Fieldhouse.

"At a Division II school you wear a lot of hats" explains Higdon. "I was responsible for staffing, setting up and tearing down after UNO events in the stadium and fieldhouse, and for outside vendors that used the facilities too."

Higdon is confident that his experience and the relationships he has built with Nebraska high school wrestling coaches and officials over the years will help him smoothly transition into his new NSAA duties.

"I know a lot of coaches and I know a lot of officials too," says Higdon. "I can hit the ground running. Dealing with coaches and having been an official will help. I've been doing camps with coaches for years. And in recruiting, it's a positive to get to know all the coaches."

After wrestling two years at Garden County Community College in Kansas, Higdon found his way to Nebraska in 1987. He finished his wrestling career at UNO, earning All-American honors by finishing fourth at the NCAA Division II Championships. His wife, Sandy, is also a UNO graduate. Higdon says he and his wife wanted to stay in Nebraska to raise their two children.

"I've had several offers to go coach somewhere else the last six weeks," says Higdon, a native of Amarillo, Texas. "God has a strange way of making things work out. I'm excited to get started."

Timing is Right as NSAA Selects Jeff Stauss to Oversee Technology

Timing is everything. Jeff Stauss is living proof of that.

Stauss was hired and approved as the NSAA's new director of technology at the May 27 Board of Director's meeting.

In March, Stauss moved from Lincoln to take a job in Kearney as a Quality Assurance Analyst at Xpansion (pronounced expansion), a software testing/consulting company.

Things have a funny way of working out.

When Stauss saw the advertisement for the assistant director's job vacated by Darin Boysen, who left to become the executive director of the Nebraska Coaches Association, he jumped at the opportunity to apply for the position.

Stauss didn't get the job. Ron Higdon's experience with wrestling was too good for the Association to pass up. So Stauss focused on his new job and new life in central Nebraska.

However, NSAA Executive Director Steve Shanahan thought Stauss' background and experience with computers seemed to be the perfect fit for the NSAA's technology needs. So Shanahan advertised for a technology administrator and asked Stauss to re-apply. Stauss did and now he's moving back to Lincoln.

"We are very lucky to have Jeff Stauss join the NSAA staff," says Dr. Shanahan. "The more I looked at his resume and experience, it was clear he was an excellent candidate. Jeff is familiar with the NSAA and his work with software, hardware, and technology really fills a vital need in our office and for our member schools. In this day and age, you need computers to accomplish everything and I have confidence Jeff will be able to move the Association forward in the area of technology."

Stauss is no stranger to the NSAA. The 2005 graduate of Meridian High School was a 2004-05 NSAA/U.S. Bank Believer & Achiever. While attending the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, Stauss spent a semester as an NSAA intern. He graduated from UNL in 2009 with his bachelor's degree in Business Administration and went to work at Sandhills Publishing in Lincoln. He started as an intern in December 2008 and then became a full-time technical support specialist in June of 2009.

"Being around athletics and activities is great," says Stauss, "I interned at the NSAA and loved every second of it."

Stauss, who also assisted the NSAA as a media coordinator at Pershing Center during the NSAA Basketball Championships the past three years, hoped that maybe working in athletics would be a part of his professional life down the road.

"The scary part of any new job is getting to know the faces, the people, and the culture of the organization. I have worked with most of the NSAA staff. They are great people and that is what I am most excited about," says Stauss.

Despite the excitement, Stauss realizes that technology is not going to be all fun and games. He has a big job keeping the office computers and network up and running, learning the software programs required to run the state championship events, updating wild card points, and staying on top of the distance learning equipment within the NSAA's three-year old office complex.

"A lot of the time, the back end stuff, people don't see, so they don't think about it. It's a challenge," explains Stauss. "With challenges, come opportunities to learn, grow, and succeed, which is an exciting part of this position."

Growing up Stauss participated in football, basketball, track & field, speech, and music at Meridian High School where his dad, Ken, was the principal and activities director. Jeff admits being in an educational family helped him realize all the time and effort it takes to run successful events.

"I did random grunt work as a kid," he states proudly. "When my dad was preparing for an event or game, he always said 'Son, why don't you help me out with this.'"

That day-to-day experience made Jeff seriously consider a career that included activities. He just didn't think it would be so soon. Stauss admits that he originally thought that 10-15 years down the road an opportunity may arise at the NSAA.

"You just never know about the timing," says Stauss, who has another date on his mind – June 23, 2012. That is the day when he and his fiancé, Joslyne Simpson, plan on getting married.

That is one month after the NSAA Boys Golf Championships – the last championship on the NSAA calendar. Pretty good timing, don't you think?

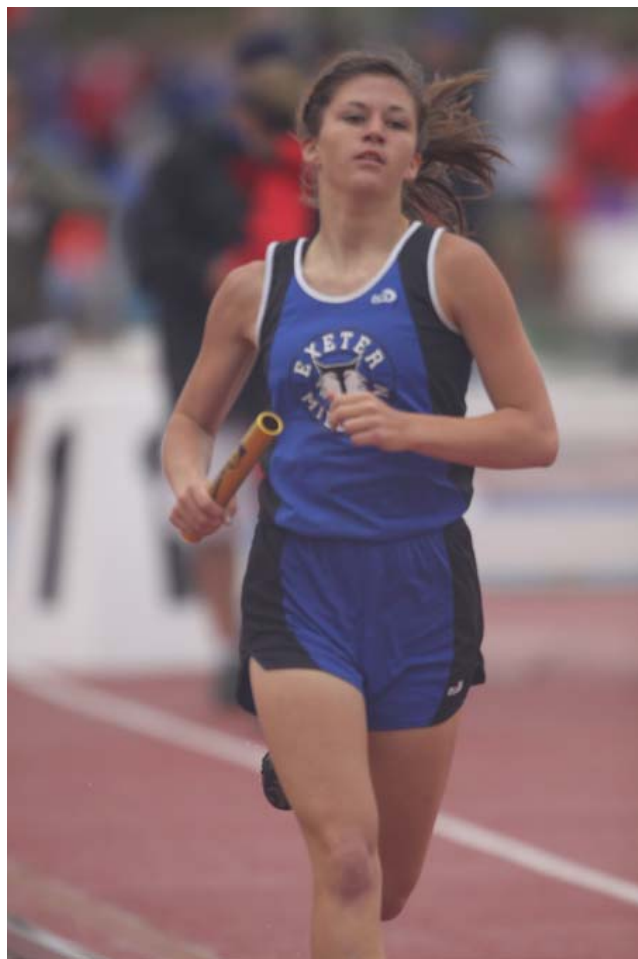

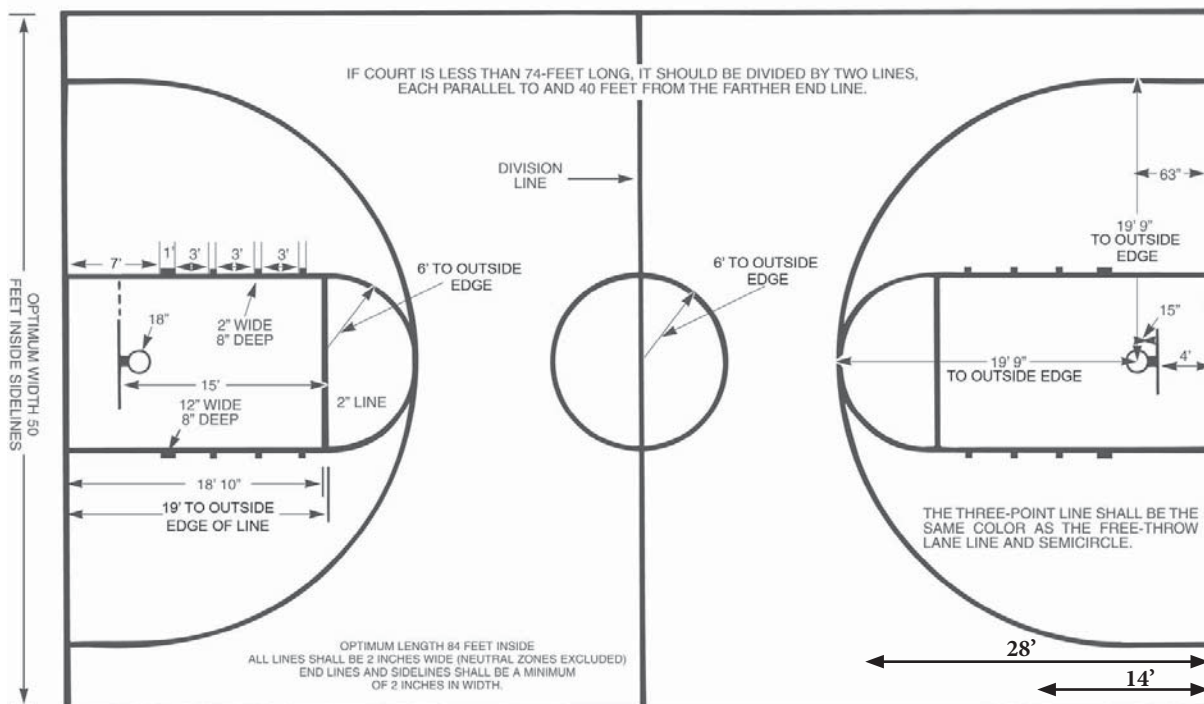
Basketball Coaching Box Extended from 6 Feet to 14 Feet

The NSAA Board of Directors unanimously voted to extend the basketball coaching box to 14 feet beginning with the 2011-12 season. The National Federation of High Schools (NFHS) basketball rules book permits a maximum 14-foot coaching box.

The coaching box shall be defined as an area outside the playing court on the tableside where the team benches are located. The coaching box shall be placed 28 feet from the end line and 14 feet from the end line located off the court marked by 2" wide by 4" long segments.

MINIMUM OF 3 FEET
Preferably 10 feet of unobstructed space outside. If impossible to provide 3 feet, a narrow broken 1-inch line should be marked inside the court parallel with and 3 feet inside the boundary.

 - b. Receive the NCA/NSIAAAA Sportsmanship Award at an NSAA Girls and/or Boys State Basketball or Soccer Championships.
 - c. Utilize the NFHS "Sportsmanship. It's up to you," materials.
 - d. Print and announce sportsmanship messages at all spectator activities.
 - e. Publicize/Highlight a public action by a student or coach from your school who exhibited good sportsmanship in the media.
 - f. Conduct a school-wide or grade level sportsmanship essay contest submitting the winning essay to the NSAA for possible publication.
 - g. Conduct another appropriate project.
3. Promote awareness and involvement in sportsmanship and citizenship efforts by accomplishing one of the following (provide evidence to verify):
 - a. Develop a Mentoring/Positive Role Model program for elementary or middle grade students.
 - b. Develop and implement a school-wide sportsmanship recognition and awards program.
 - c. Develop a local publicity campaign to produce and present sportsmanship-related public service announcements, local bulletin boards and community service projects.
 - d. Conduct a school or community sportsmanship workshop.
4. Conduct an internal sportsmanship audit or evaluation involving students, staff and community to determine areas of success and specific areas needing improvement.
5. Did not have a coach or multiple athlete ejections at any level of athletic competition during the school year.
