The NSAA school membership presents a diverse population of students and staff to be represented by the district representative on the Board of Control with differences of race, color, national origin, religion, marital status, sex, age, or disability. In selecting the district representative for the Board of Control, school members of each district are encouraged to consider the diversity of the member schools, students, and staff of such district in the context of the representation of such diverse groups as part of the nomination and individualized consideration of each applicant for a position on the Board of Control.

1.6.1.2 Each member of the Board of Control shall be a superintendent of schools, a high school principal, or a supervisor whose duties are primarily administrative and are of such nature to require an administrative and supervisory certificate.

1.6.1.3 Election and term of office. Members of the board of control shall be elected at annual district meetings. The term of office shall be three years and shall commence on August 1 succeeding the date of election. An alternate member of the Board of Control shall be chosen in each district to succeed to membership on the Board of Control in case of a vacancy in the district represented. - (2) No student shall take part in more than four volleyball matches per day in tournament competition. When a Nebraska team plays in an out-of-state tournament, the Nebraska school may play five matches in one day if that is the rule of the governing body of that state.
- (a) In other than tournament competition, no student may participate in more than two matches per day.
- (b) No student shall take part in more than six volleyball matches per week , except in tournament competition. The matches-per-week limitation does not apply to postponed contests.
- (c) Any participation during a set on any match counts as participation in that match.

1. The 28 schools in Class A are divided into five districts. The district assignments divided the Omaha Metropolitan area into three districts by enrollment going from left to right. The six Lincoln schools, Elkhorn, Fremont, Grand Island, Kearney, Norfolk, and North Platte were placed in two districts by enrollment going left to right. The teams within the district will play a round-robin schedule with the first and second teams in each district qualifying for the football playoffs. Using the point system and point system tie-breaker, next six teams with the highest regular season point averages that did not finish as the 1st or 2nd place team in their district will qualify for the playoffs, making a total of sixteen teams.
2. Using a sixteen-team bracket, the point system and point system tie-breaker will be used to seed the 16 qualifying teams.

Class A tie-breaker steps for determining district places:

1. To determine first and second places, the win-loss record within the district will be the first consideration.
2. If teams are tied, win-loss record between the tied teams will be considered.
3. If the tie cannot be broken by Step 2, the score differential in competition between the tied teams will be considered. (Cap of plus or minus 13 points; overtime games will be considered plus or minus ½ point regardless of the final score.)
4. If at any step there are only two teams tied, we will go to Step 2 to break the tie.
5. If the tie cannot be broken by Step 3, the score differential in all district games will be considered. (Cap of plus or minus 13 points; overtime games will be considered plus or minus ½ regardless of final score.)
6. If the tie remains, the overall winning percentage in all games played will be considered.
7. If necessary, the point system average and point system tie-breaker will be used to break the tie.

Radio and Television

1. Broadcasting, recording, photographing, videotaping, or televising of NSAA-sponsored events shall not be permitted for commercial purposes, or for other than personal use, except with the expressed permission of the Nebraska School Activities Association. Telecasting of a Sub-district or District tournament, on a live basis, is prohibited.
2. Telecasting of a State Football Playoff game on a live basis except via internet streaming is prohibited for commercial purposes only.
3. Radio and/or internet broadcasts and streaming telecasts of State Football Playoff games shall be permitted, provided ample space is available for the broadcast crew(s).
4. It is the decision of the teams in the State Football Playoffs if a broadcast fee is to be charged. The practice of charging a broadcast fee is discouraged; however, if a fee is charged, the competing schools shall set the amount of the fee, not to exceed \$50 per State Playoff game.
5. Videotaping for delayed telecasting is permitted if the host school approves and cable stations agree to follow the NSAA delayed telecast policy.

1. Class A schools are the 32 largest schools playing girls/boys golf and are assigned to four, eight team districts.
2. All 32 Class A will be assigned to four districts using a winning percentage based on tournament play during the year. Highest winning percentage in tournament play will be placed in District 1, the next highest winning percentage will be placed in District 2, next highest percentage District 3, next highest percentage District 4, next highest percentage District 4 and the next highest percentage District 3. Continue using the serpentine method, until all schools are assigned.
3. Tournaments that will count towards the record/winning percentage are Tournaments that have 5 or more teams that are played by Week 11 girls and played by week 43 boys. Results of the tournaments will be sent to the NSAA by each host school. If you have an 8 team tournament the records for the teams would be: 1st place 8-0, 2nd place 7-1, 3rd place 6-2, and so on.
4. To qualify for seeding, each school must play in a minimum of 3 tournaments (regardless of class). If a school does not qualify for seeding, the NSAA will assign teams by enrollment largest school to smallest school using the serpentine method in the remaining spots in each district.
5. Team records will be converted to winning percentages at the end of Week 11 for girls and Week 43 for boys. The NSAA will seed the district tournament.
6. District hosts will be the highest seeded team. If that team cannot host, the second seed will be offered and so on until a school and course is found. The district course cannot be the State Course.

Entries. All entries (swimming/diving) must be submitted electronically on the NSAA webpage under the School Login section.

- All entries for the State Swimming and Diving Championships must meet the automatic qualifying standard. If there are not 32 competitors entered in a swimming event who have met the qualifying standard, additional qualifiers who have met the secondary standard will be added based on time to reach 32 entries. If there are not enough secondary time entries submitted to reach 32, additional entries will not be added. The secondary time represents 8% of the qualifying standard for individual events and 5% for relays. Individuals to be considered as additional qualifiers must be submitted for consideration at the time that entries are due in the NSAA office. *If there is a tie for the 32nd spot (secondary time), an additional heat will not be added.

- The automatic 11-dive standard for both boys and girls is set at 300 with no secondary standard. There is no 6-dive automatic dive standard. If there are fewer than 32 automatic state diving qualifying entries, additional divers will not be added.
