NSAA Bylaws and Approved Rulings Governing Volleyball

2.12.2.2 AR	<p>Rules Meeting</p> <p>The NSAA presents rules meetings in order to inform and educate coaches, officials, and judges about NFHS playing rules and rules changes, NSAA guidelines and approved rulings, and to discuss health and safety issues related to activities participation.</p> <p>All head coaches are required to attend an NSAA Rules Meeting or complete an NSAA Rules Meeting online annually. Failure to do so will result in possible late fees and suspension penalties.</p> <p>Online rules meetings are initially offered at no cost to coaches or officials, followed by a period with a \$25 “Late” Fee, followed by a period with a \$50 “Delinquent” Fee. The following sanctions and fees are applicable to those coaches who fail to complete the rules meeting by the expiration of the “Delinquent” Fee period.</p> <p><i>Absence from the required rules meeting OR FAILURE TO COMPLETE THE ONLINE RULES MEETING by August 26th will result in the following sanctions:</i></p> <p>First Offense in Three-Year Period</p> <p>The head coach will be suspended from coaching in any competition in that activity until</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) <i>The head coach COMPLETES THE NSAA’S ONLINE RULES MEETING OFFERED AT THE LATE FEE of \$100; and</i> (2) <i>the head coach successfully completes the open book test for officials/judges of that activity (70% or higher); and the school’s administration verifies that the coach has read all the supporting NSAA, National Federation, and safety information.</i> <p>During this regular season suspension period, the head coach may continue to coach the team at practices.</p> <p>Second and Subsequent Offenses in Three-Year Period</p> <p>The head coach will be suspended from coaching in all NSAA end-of-season play (subdistricts, districts, playoffs, and state competition).</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) <i>The head coach COMPLETES THE NSAA’S ONLINE RULES MEETING OFFERED AT THE LATE FEE of \$200; and</i> (2) <i>the head coach successfully completes the open book test for officials/judges of that activity (70% or higher); and the school’s administration verifies that the coach has read all the supporting NSAA, National Federation, and safety information.</i> <p>During this regular season suspension period, the head coach may continue to coach the team at practices.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>2011 Rules Meeting Schedule</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>August 1-August 16 No Charge of Head Coaches</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>August 17 to August 23 – Basic \$25 Fee – Head Coaches</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>August 24-26 – Late/Penalty \$50 Fee – Head Coaches</i></p>
3.1.1 AR	<p>End of Season for Outside Participation. A season begins on the first day of allowable practices for that sport, as designated in 3.1.1.2. The season officially ends with the conclusion of the State Championship in that sport. Students may not participate in outside group instruction or competition once the season officially begins, and outside group instruction or competition may not commence until the school team has been completely eliminated from further participation in the sport.</p>
3.2.3	<p>Organized Practice</p>
	<p>No organized practice in any sport shall be held during the “school year, out-of-season” period. In volleyball, more than four players working under the supervision of a sponsor is an organized practice. If more than one group is practicing at the same time, it is an organized practice.</p>
3.2.6.1	<p>“School-Year, Out-of-Season” Clinics</p>
	<p>Athletes and coaches may attend professional or commercial sports clinics sponsored by non-member high schools. During the “school-year, out-of-season” period, the organized practice rule for the sport in which instruction is being given shall apply. No more than the limit permitted for organized practice may attend and receive instruction. Attendance to “school-year, out-of-season” clinics shall be voluntary. No coach or school representative may directly or by implication direct a student to attend a clinic as a condition for membership on the high school team or restrict the level of team participation within the high school program.</p>

3.2.8	Summer Activities
	From the Tuesday following Memorial Day to July 31, a member school may not sponsor a team or individual, provide uniforms, individual player equipment or otherwise be responsible for a student in summer competition. Attendance at all summer activities shall be voluntary. No coach or school representative may directly or by implication direct a student to attend summer activities as a condition for membership on a high school team or restrict the level of team participation within the high school program.
3.2.8.1	During the summer a member school may organize the following:
3.2.8.2	Summertime School-Sponsored Camps/Clinics: A school may organize a camp or clinic in any sport from the Tuesday following Memorial Day through July 31. The camp shall be limited to no more than ten days over a period of 21 consecutive calendar days starting with the first date of the camp/clinic. Summertime school-sponsored camps/clinics include planned physical activities that are instructional and competitive in nature where actual sets can be played or simulated by camp attendees. Summertime school-sponsored camps/clinics shall be voluntary and open to all interested students from grades 9-12. The use of school facilities, equipment, and vehicles are permitted in accordance with local school board policy.
3.2.8.3	Summertime Conditioning Program
	A member school may organize and supervise a summer conditioning program to include weight lifting, running, and exercising for its members in accordance with the following provision: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Such a conditioning program shall be general in nature and may include only exercises designed to promote physical fitness. b. Sport specific drills are not allowed, and sport specific equipment may not be used. c. Conditioning sessions shall be no longer than 60 minutes in length, and no member shall participate in more than one such session per day.
3.2.8.4	Summertime Open Gym
	Scrimmage
	It is permissible for students to be involved in NSAA activities of a school's open gymnasium program during the summer under the following conditions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. The gym is open for all individuals and all activities. b. Schools may not designate sport specific times. c. Coaching or instruction is not provided. d. School employees who are present restrict their duties to supervision of the facility. e. Permitting the participation by non-high school students (graduates, adults or individuals not a member of the school) shall be determined by local school board policy.
	Prior to the first contest date for the fall season, only intra-squad matches or scrimmages are permitted. After the first contest date for fall sports, a school may have inter- or intra-squad matches and scrimmages. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. However, alumni matches or scrimmages, or matches/scrimmages with non-high school teams are not allowed. b. During the volleyball season, a school shall not permit a student who is not a member of the high school's team, an adult, a college student, or alumni to participate in any practice session, drill, scrimmage, or match in which a school team is involved. This does not prevent a coach from being involved for the primary purposes of teaching and demonstrating skills, methods, or techniques. c. Any inter-squad scrimmage shall count as one of the 16 permitted matches.
3.2.8.8	Summertime Use of School Facilities. Member schools may permit the use of their facilities in accordance with local school board rental policy.
3.3.2	Characteristics of a interschool scrimmage: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. No charge for admission. b. No spectators other than those who regularly attend practice. c. No paid officials. d. No advertising. e. No publicity regarding the scrimmage. f. No scoreboard, no official score. g. Coaches are permitted to stop scrimmage to instruct players and may terminate scrimmage at any time.

	Contests shall not be held with any team, which does not belong to the NSAA, or to its own state high school association.
3.3.7	Incomplete Matches
	If a school takes its team off the playing field prior to the completion of a contest or prior to the suspension or termination of a match by the match officials, and the contest is forfeited because of the refusal of the school's team to continue play, the school shall be subject to a penalty set by the Board of Directors. The penalty may be the exclusion from participation in subdistrict, district, or state contests.
3.3.7 AR	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. In all athletic activities, teams wishing to enter a subdistrict, district, or state contest shall have participated in a minimum of five interschool varsity contests prior to the subdistrict, district, or state contest. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Exceptions to the requirements for a team that has not participated in at least five interschool varsity contests would be considered if the team was unable to participate if weather conditions forced a cancellation of scheduled contests. Other extenuating circumstances would be considered by the Executive Director on a case-by-case basis. 2. In order to participate in a district or state tournament, a student is required to have been a member of the school's team for at least twenty school days prior to the first day of the subdistrict, district, or state tournament. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Exceptions to the requirements for a student who is not a member of the school team for twenty school days would be considered if an individual was unable to participate because of illness, injury, or transfer from another high school. School, team, or suspensions, regardless of the underlying cause, shall not be considered as exceptions to this participation rule. 3. In all athletic activities, students wishing to enter a subdistrict, district, or state contest shall have been available to participate in at least 30% of the school's varsity interschool contests prior to the subdistrict, district, or state contest. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) Exceptions to the requirements for a student who has not been available to participate in at least 30% of the school's varsity interschool contests would be considered if an individual was unable to participate because of illness, injury, transfer from another high school, or if weather conditions forced a cancellation of scheduled contests. School, team, or match suspensions, regardless of the underlying cause, shall not be considered as exceptions to this participation rule. (b) When determining whether a student has been available for 30% of the school's varsity interschool contests, one would divide the number of varsity interschool contests for which the student was available by the school's total number of varsity interschool contests; all decimals .1 or above would be rounded up to the next higher whole number. (c) The term "available to participate" means that the student was a bona fide member of the team, eligible to participate for the school at some level of competition in the sport, not suspended from participation in activities for violation of school, team, or NSAA rules, and not involved in outside participation activities (exception: Olympic Development Program or national team activities as approved by the NSAA.) 4. For situations pertaining to eligibility to participate in district or state contests that are not specifically addressed by these guidelines, the Executive Director shall have the authority to waive membership and participation requirements on a case-by-case basis.
3.3.7.2	The Executive Director is granted the authority to require schools to alter travel plans to arrive the day prior to the scheduled state contest if weather conditions so warrant. If a school chooses not to travel to the contest site the day prior to the scheduled contest, the school shall understand that the matches will go on as scheduled and if they are unable to arrive prior to the scheduled match time, a forfeit will be issued.
3.5.1	Outside Participation
	Any student who participates in an athletic contest other than as a representative of his/her high school during the volleyball season shall become ineligible to represent his/her school in volleyball for one or more matches or the remainder of the season. (This rule applies to club volleyball, church league matches, independent matches, sand volleyball tournaments and matches where contestants are selected at random, etc.) <i>The exception to this rule would be for activities that are school-sponsored such as half-time basketball shooting or volleyball serving contests, parent-child golf outings at the local course, or fun runs/ walks in support of a designated charity.</i>

3.5.1 AR	Eligibility for District/State Competition
	<p>Eligibility for District/State Competition. To be eligible to participate in a district and/or state contest a student shall have been a member of the school's team and shall have been available to participate in at least eighty percent (80%) of the school's scheduled interschool contests and not have missed more than twenty percent (20%) of the school's scheduled contests because of participating in non-high school competition.</p> <p>(a) The term "available to participate" means that the student was a bona fide member of the team, eligible to participate for the school at some level of competition in the sport, and not involved in outside participation activities (exception: Olympic Development Program or national team activities as approved by the NSAA.)</p> <p>(b) The term, "school's scheduled interschool contests," is defined as those contests which appear on the school's varsity schedule at the beginning of the season. An exception to this requirement will be considered if a student was unable to participate because of injury, illness, or had transferred from another high school.</p>
3.5.2	Outside Practices, Tryouts and Participation
	<p>During the season of a sport, a student is permitted to take individualized instruction from a person other than the high school coach. Individualized instruction shall not take the place of the high school practice. Group instruction, practices with outside teams, and tryouts for outside teams other than as a part of a college or university-recruiting visit, however, are not permitted.</p>
3.11.11.3	Match Limitations
	<p>No team representing a member school may participate in more than sixteen matches, in addition to the state sponsored series of tournaments from the date of the first permitted contest to the close of the state tournament.</p> <p>A team may not participate in more than five tournaments, which includes the conference tournament. Participation in any volleyball tournament shall count as one match of the sixteen matches permitted.</p> <p>No team may exceed thirty competition points prior to the district and state tournaments.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Competition points are assigned according to the following chart.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Dual match – 1 point 2. Triangular match – 2 points 3. Four-team one-day tournament, 2 match maximum – 2 points 4. Four-team round robin tournaments – 3 points 5. One-day tournaments of more than four teams – 3 points 6. Two or three-day tournaments – 4 points
	<p>The 16-match limit pertains to each level of competition at which a school may sponsor a team.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. A school's varsity may have sixteen matches. b. A school's junior varsity may have a schedule independent of sixteen matches. <p>The following school and student limitations apply:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) A triangular volleyball match, three schools playing two contests or playing two other schools in one session (night), counts as only one match. The NSAA shall permit a double-triangular in which there are 4-teams present and each team would play two of the other teams present in a triangular format. The double-triangular must take place in one evening/session. The schedule shall be pre-determined by the host as to which of the four teams will comprise each triangular. The double-triangular format in which each of the schools participates in two pre-determined matches shall count as one match and two competition points. (2) No student shall take part in more than four volleyball matches per day in tournament competition <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (a) In other than tournament competition, no student may participate in more than two matches per day. (b) No student shall take part in more than six volleyball matches per week, except in tournament competition. The matches-per-week limitation does not apply to postponed contests. (c) Any participation during a set of any match counts as participation in that match.
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> (3) A school that violates the team match limitation may be disqualified from district and state tournament competition. <p>A school that violates the player limitations shall be assessed a point/loss of rally and the player shall be removed from the set. The match shall then continue.</p>

	If it is noticed by the scorer or brought to the scorer's attention that a player has violated the player limitation rule, the scorer shall notify the officials who then shall verify the violation and assess the penalty.
	Exhibition or unattached participation in inter-high school competition to circumvent game, match or meet limitations shall not be permitted.
	Tournament Definition
	A tournament is defined as a contest involving four or more teams in which the winner continues to advance and compete until a single winner is determined or through round-robin competition and competes until a single winner is chosen. A team is required to have a thirty-minute rest period only between the second and third matches of a tournament. The thirty minutes includes the warm-up period before the third match. No volleyball team may use more than 14 players in any tournament, and no more than 14 players may be suited up for any tournament match. In case of player injury or sickness, the tournament director may sanction the use of more than fourteen players.
	Varsity Schedules
	All varsity schedules must be submitted online by Thursday, August 25. After the season begins, there will be NO additions. Cancellations or postponements due to weather must be e-mailed or called into the NSAA office. Every varsity volleyball match must be contested in either a two-of-three set format or a three-of-five set format. This includes dual, triangular, pool and tournament competition. When playing the best two-of-three format, the first team to win two sets shall be the winner of the match. All sets shall be 25 points (no cap). When playing the best three-of-five set format, the first team to win three sets shall be the winner of the match. The first four sets shall be 25 points (no cap), and a team must win by two points. The fifth and deciding set shall be 15 points (no cap), and a team must win by two points. All scheduled and postponed regular season varsity contests must be played prior to the start of Subdistrict, District, or State competition. Once Subdistrict, District, or State competition begins, no regular varsity contests shall be permitted.
3.11.11.3 (2)	Out-State Tournaments
	When a Nebraska team plays in an out-of-state tournament, the Nebraska school may play five matches in one day if that is the rule that governs in that state.

Sportsmanship Bylaws & Approved Rulings

2.11.3 Participant Ejections from Athletic Contests. Any participant ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be ineligible for the next athletic contest at that level of competition and all other athletic contests at any level during the interim, in addition to the other penalties the NSAA or the school may assess.

Approved Ruling 2.11.3 *Any participant ejected a second time during a season from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be ineligible for the next two contests at that level of competition and all other athletic contests at any level during the interim, in addition to other penalties the NSAA or school may assess. Any participant ejected a third time shall be ineligible for the next three contests at that level of competition and all other athletic contests at any level during the interim, in addition to other penalties the NSAA or school may assess. When schools have students or coaches with multiple ejections, the school shall submit to the NSAA a written management plan on how they plan to remediate the problem.*

2.11.4 Coach Ejections from Athletic Contests. Any coach ejected from a contest for unsportsmanlike conduct shall be ineligible to coach the next athletic contest at that level of competition and all other athletic contests at any level during the interim, in addition to the other penalties the NSAA or the school may assess.

Approved Ruling 2.11.4 *Coaches who are ejected will be required to successfully complete the NFHS Sportsmanship online course within 10 days of the ejection at the coaches' expense. Failure by an ejected coach to successfully complete the NFHS Sportsmanship online course within 10 days of the ejection will result in the coach being suspended from coaching in any further competition in that activity for the remainder of the season, including all NSAA end-of-season play (subdistricts, districts, playoffs, and state competition.) In those situations in which the ejection of the coach occurs near the end of the season or during the NSAA end-of-season play, the coach will be required to successfully complete the NFHS Sportsmanship online*

course before being able to coach the following season or year. Coaches who are ejected a second time will be required to sit-out the next two contests at that level, plus all other contests at other levels during the interim and successfully complete the NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching online course within 10 days of the ejection at the coaches' expense. Failure to successfully complete the NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching online course within 10 days of the ejection will result in the coach being suspended from coaching in any further competition in that activity for the remainder of the season, including all NSAA end-of-season play (subdistricts, districts, playoffs, and state competition.) In those situations in which the ejection of the coach occurs near the end of the season or during the NSAA end-of-season play, the coach will be required to successfully complete the NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching online course before being able to coach the following season or year.

3.3.11 Conduct and Sportsmanship. Member schools shall maintain proper crowd control and enforce the principles of good sportsmanship and ethics during all interscholastic contests. Failure to fulfill this obligation shall subject the school to penalties as provided in Article 2, Section 2.11, NSAA Bylaws Governing All Activities.

3.3.11.1 Conduct of Coaches and Athletes. Coaches and athletes shall conduct themselves in accordance with the playing rules of the sport contest and refrain from unsportsmanlike conduct during interscholastic competition. Failure to fulfill this obligation will subject the individual(s) to the penalties as provided in Article 2, Section 2.11, NSAA Bylaws Governing All Activities.

3.3.11.2 Definition of Unsportsmanlike Conduct. Unsportsmanlike conduct shall include the following: fighting, verbal abuse or dissent directed toward an official or opponent, racial or ethnic slurs, inappropriate comments or actions that may be construed as sexual harassment, profanity, obscene gestures, flagrant and violent fouls, taunting, trash talk, baiting, cheating, throwing or abusing equipment, inappropriate posters, physical intimidation or abuse of an official or opponent, and unauthorized leaving of a team bench area.

There is no appeal process for ejections for unsportsmanlike conduct.

In the realm of good sportsmanship, it is the expectation that all student spectators to wear shirts for all subdistrict, district, and state events. Each individual school shall be responsible for assuring that student spectators are appropriately attired.

Participants must keep their uniforms on while in the competition area.

Classification of Schools

1. Schools shall be divided into six classes for volleyball competition.
2. This classification is based on combined boy and girl enrollment, grades 9-11 from September of the year, which immediately precedes the one-year classification period.
 - a. The 28 largest schools registered for volleyball shall be Class A.
 - b. The next 32 largest schools registered for volleyball shall be Class B.
 - c. The remaining schools registered for volleyball are divided into four classes, C1, C2, D1, D2, with an equal or near equal number in each class.
3. If schools are tied in enrollment for the last position or positions of a class, the following tie-breaker will be applied:
 - a. The first tie-breaker will be a three-year average of enrollment which includes the year on which the current year's classification is based and the two previous years. The higher three-year average will be in the larger class.
 - b. If the tie still exists, then the school with the higher immediate previous year's enrollment will be placed in the larger class.
 - c. If a tie still exists, it will be decided by a coin flip in the NSAA office.

Varsity Matches

1. Regular season in-state and inter-state dual, triangular, tournament shall consist of either the best three-out-of-five set format or the best two-out-of-three set format as mutually agreed upon by the participating schools and stipulated on a written contract.
 - 3-out-of-5
All sets played to 25 points
Deciding set played to 15 points
No cap
 - 2-out-of-3
All sets, including the deciding, played to 25 points
No cap
2. Subdistrict/district/state format shall consist of the best three-out-of-five set format.

Non-Varsity Matches. Modification of match format is permitted for matches below the varsity level as mutually agreed by the schools.

Matches Not Permitted During The State Tournament

1. No volleyball matches in any class, other than the state tournament matches, are permitted during the dates of **November 10, 11, 12.**
This includes regular season matches, non-varsity tournaments, and conference tournaments or playoffs.

Official Rules. National Federation Volleyball Rules shall govern all competition.

Line Judges – Rule 5-8-4, by state high school association adoption, line judges may use flags. *In Nebraska, line judges may use flags. Line judges will determine whether or not they will use flags. If flags are used, both line judges must use flags.*

Line Judges shall be fair and impartial. Line judges shall avoid wearing any attire that makes reference to a school or team.

Non-Varsity Uniforms

The uniforms worn by non-varsity teams do not have to be identical. They must have permanent numbers, but duplicate numbers can be on the roster. Duplicate numbers cannot be worn by participants simultaneously.

Videotaping and Filming

1. A school may videotape or film the match(s) in which its team plays.
2. Prior permission should be received from the host school.
3. Videotaping or filming a match, in which the recording school is not playing, is not permitted.

Warm-up

There shall be a minimum of 16-minutes warm-up for all interschool matches.

The warm-up period shall be divided as follows for district and state competition:

- 4 minutes—Both teams on their sides of the court.
- 5 minutes—Home team both sides of the court.
- 5 minutes—Visiting team both sides of the court.
- 2 minutes—Both teams serve from their sides of the court.

For varsity regular season play, warm-up time shall be a minimum of 16-minutes, divided as listed above or mutually agreed upon divisions by the schools.

For varsity regular season tournament play, warm-up time for all competition matches – other than the team's first contest of the day – may be 11-minutes divided as follows:

- 3 minutes—Both teams on their sides of the court.
- 3 minutes—Home team both sides of the court.
- 3 minutes—Visiting team both sides of the court.
- 2 minutes—Both teams serve from their sides of the court.

Non-varsity warm-up shall be as listed unless the schools mutually agree to other arrangements.

- It is not automatically within the authority/duties of the referee/umpire to dictate the warm-up schedule. If the match officials are to direct warm-ups, meet management should make this a part of pre-match arrangements with the officials.
- It shall be the official timer's responsibility to notify each team when it is time to change drills.
- When a team is allowed both sides of the court, the other team must be completely off the 30x60 playing court and the playable area adjacent to the playing court.
- When a team occupies both sides of the court during warm-up, it may perform whatever practice format it chooses, including serving. Serving is the only skill allowed during the warm-up-serving period. Another skill/activity may be conducted during this time only if the involved schools mutually agree prior to the start of warm-ups.

Subdistrict and District Information

Subdistrict and District Assignments

1. Schools, which submitted the volleyball declaration form to the NSAA, were assigned to subdistricts and districts in the manner given below.
2. **Class A** schools will be divided in seven districts. Those district sites would be determined at the start of the season. All of the seven districts will be determined using a serpentine method (not modified), based upon the NSAA wild card point system within one week prior to the first district competition. *The highest seeded volleyball team in each Class A district shall host that particular district.*

3. **Class B** schools are divided into six districts. The schools were assigned to districts on a geographical basis starting with the schools in western Nebraska and working east. North to south direction was used in some cases in order to decrease the distance between the schools within a district.
 - a. The winning team in each district will qualify for the state tournament.
 - b. Two additional teams will also qualify on the basis of the wild card selection procedure.
4. **Classes C1, C2, D1 and D2** schools are divided into twelve subdistricts on geographical basis starting with the schools in western Nebraska and working east. North to south direction was used in some cases in order to decrease the distance between the schools within a district.
 - a. The teams winning the subdistricts will advance to the district final.
 - b. The six teams in each class winning the district finals will advance to the state tournament.
 - c. Two additional teams in each class will also qualify on the basis of the wild card team selection procedure.
5. If a school decides not to compete after district assignments are made, no change will be made in district assignments. If two or more schools decide not to compete, or two or more schools close, consolidate, or enter into a cooperative agreement, the districts may be adjusted to restore a near-equal number of schools or to take advantage of a reduction in travel distance.

Admission

Admission prices for subdistrict and district and district final volleyball tournaments shall be:

- \$4.00 for students per session
- \$5.00 for adults per session.

Complimentary Passes

1. The host school shall provide complimentary passes to the competing schools.
2. Participant passes for players and student manager shall not exceed 18; 2 coaches' passes shall be provided.

3. Extra passes for administrative and supervisory personnel from each school shall be as follows:
 - a. Class A, 10 passes.
 - b. Class B, 8 passes.
 - c. Classes C1 and C2, D1 and D2, 6 passes

Tournament Ball

The tournament ball shall be a three-color (navy/gray/white) VX5EC-213. Each Director will receive a tournament ball from Baden Sports.



Determination of Home Teams

In all tournaments, the top team of the paired bracket shall be considered the home team.

District Director's Responsibilities

The director of the tournament is granted full authority for the conduct and management of the tournament and is responsible for the administration of rules, regulations and accounting of all finances.

1. **Seedings and Pairings.**
 - a. The NSAA is responsible for the seedings and pairings of teams assigned to the subdistrict or district. The district director shall provide the NSAA with match times. The NSAA will make the pairings on the date established and post the pairings on the internet.
 - b. A varsity team from a school may play a junior varsity team of any classification or a team from a state not contiguous with Nebraska and must count that match toward the total number of permitted contests, but may not count such match toward subdistrict, district, and state competition seeding.
 - c. District competition shall be seeded based on wild card point averages. The most recent point average computed on the seeding date set prior to the first contest of the district tournament shall be the points used. The records of all schools available to the NSAA on the date of the seeding shall be used to calculate wild card averages, even if an error on the record is discovered after the fact.
 - 1) If two teams are tied with identical point averages and have played each other, the results of the competition between these schools will be considered and the team winning the majority of contests between the two teams tied will be given the higher seed.
 - 2) If a tie still exists, or if more than two teams are tied, the team or teams playing the greatest number of first division teams will be selected. If two teams are still tied, criteria 1) will apply before going to step 3).
 - 3) If the tie still exists, total the sum of the tied teams' opponents' wins and losses. The team whose opponents have the higher winning percentage will receive the higher seed. If two teams remain tied, criteria 1) will apply before going to step 4).
 - 4) If a tie still exists, the higher seed will be decided by a coin flip in the NSAA office.
2. **Brackets.** Teams shall be placed on brackets.
 - a. **A four-team subdistrict/district will be scheduled on one day.**
Match 1–Seeds 1 vs 4; Match 2–Seeds 3 vs 2, 30 minute break, Match 3 –Championship
 - b. **A five-team subdistrict/district will be scheduled in two days.**
Day 1 – Match 1–Seeds 4 vs 5, Match 2–Seeds 3 vs 2, Match 3–Seed 1 vs winner 4 vs 5
Day 2 – Championship
 - c. **A six-team subdistrict/district will be scheduled in three days.**
Day 1 – Match 1–Seeds 4 vs 5, Match 2–Seeds 3 vs 6
Day 2 – Match 3–Seed 1 vs winner of 4 vs 5, Match 4, Seed winner 3 vs 6 vs Seed 2
Day 3 – Match 5 – Championship

A request for a modification of the above format must be approved through the NSAA Office with all participating schools agreeing to the change in format. Modifications would be considered for a 5-

team format to be played on one day or a six-team format to be played on two days. At any point in which a team would be confronted with playing matches back-to-back, a 30-minute break shall be implemented into the schedule.

3. **Reports. Financial Report Form.**

1. The financial report should be completed immediately following the close of the tournament. The financial report is provided in an electronic format for subdistrict and district directors. You will need to go to the NSAA homepage and Login. Towards the bottom of the Login page for your school, under Time Sensitive Forms, click on Financial Form. Click on the appropriate volleyball form representative of the district you have hosted.
2. Enter the following information: gross receipts; approximate attendance; cost of officials' fees; cost of officials' mileage; and one-way mileage of each competing school. Click calculate.
3. The electronic financial form will compute all of the calculations for the Director. Once calculations are completed, approval will be granted and the form will show how much should be paid to each competing school and how much should be paid to the NSAA. Click submit. The Director should mail checks along with a copy of the electronic financial form to the NSAA and all competing schools immediately following the close of the tournament.
4. Subdistrict and District contests are considered NSAA activities. Student admission waivers under the Student Fees statutes will not be permitted.

Division of Gate Receipts

1. In subdistrict and A-B districts the division of gate receipts shall be as follows:
 - a. Match officials.
 - b. Host school's allowance.
 - c. 8% of gross receipts to NSAA for catastrophic insurance.
 - d. 25% gross receipts to host school.
 - e. 25% gross receipts to NSAA.
 - f. Team expenses, mileage allowance only.
 - g. Balance for bonus.
 - 1) If the tournament site is the home floor of, or a site rented by a participating school, then the host school shall receive a per-match share of the bonus equal to the per-match share received by each participating school. The bonus shall be divided as follows:
 - a) 10% NSAA.
 - b) 90% participating schools.
 - 2) If the host school is not a participating school, the bonus shall be divided as follows:
 - a) 15% host.
 - b) 10% NSAA.
 - c) 75% participating schools.
 - h. The host school allowance shall be:
 - 4-Team Tournament--\$100.00
 - 5-Team Tournament--\$125.00
 - 6-Team Tournament--\$150.00
 - i. Team expenses are for mileage only and shall be \$1.70 per mile per trip one way.
 - j. If the schools participating in a district tournament wish to have a dinner meeting, conference call, or other special meetings for planning the tournament, the expenses of these special meetings must come from each school's share of the bonus.
 - 1) If there is no bonus, each school may be assessed a proportional part of the expenses.
 - 2) These expenses may not be listed as tournament expenses.

When a school accepts the invitation to host a tournament or playoff match, there is a possibility that tournament expenses will exceed revenue. An understanding should be reached that the competing schools may be assessed a certain fee to offset a potential deficit due to insufficient tournament receipts.

Inclement Weather

1. Snowstorms or other inclement weather conditions may force the postponement of a subdistrict or district contest.
2. In determining whether to postpone or to hold the contest(s) as scheduled, the director should consider the following factors:
 - a. The weather and road conditions at the site of the contest.
 - b. Existing weather and road conditions at the location of the schools, which are to compete that day.
 - c. Road conditions between tournament site and the competing schools.
 - d. The weather conditions immediately prior to, during, and following the contest, as reported by the weather bureau.
3. If after considering the various factors, the tournament director determines that competition is to go on as scheduled, all schools are to be notified early enough so as to allow each team sufficient time to travel to the contest site.
4. Once the decision has been made to hold the event as scheduled and any team has begun to travel, the contest(s) shall be played.
5. If the tournament director feels a postponement is necessary, he/she shall get permission from the Executive Director before postponing the day's activities.
6. Once the tournament has been postponed, the director shall be responsible for setting the new time, date, and site, if necessary, for the continuation of the tournament.
7. The previously agreed upon schedule may have to be changed to allow the contest(s) to be completed by the required dates.
8. Neither tournament receipts nor funds from the NSAA are to be used to reimburse any school for additional expenses incurred because of a postponed contest.

Plaques and Awards

1. No plaques are awarded in subdistrict competition.
2. In Classes A and B, plaques for the runner-up and championship teams will be shipped to the district director.
3. In Classes C1, C2, D1, and D2, plaques will be sent to the director of the odd-number subdistrict to be handed over to the district final directors.
4. In all classes, plaques will be awarded to the Wild Card Qualifiers.

Protests

1. The NSAA will honor a protest based upon the eligibility of a player.
2. If the protest is allowed and a forfeit is necessary, the last match the team played will be forfeited.
3. Protests based on decisions of officials during a match will not be accepted.
4. The director has full authority to make final settlement of all protests not covered above.

Radio and Television

1. Telecasting of a Subdistrict or District tournament, on a live basis, is prohibited.
2. Radio or audio web broadcasts of Subdistrict and District matches shall be permitted, provided ample space is available for the broadcast crew(s).
3. It is the decision of the teams in the tournament if a broadcast fee is to be charged. The practice of charging a broadcast fee is discouraged; however, if a fee is charged, the competing schools shall set the amount of the fee, not to exceed \$50 per tournament.
4. Videotaping for delayed telecasting is permitted if the host school approves and cable stations agree to follow the NSAA delayed telecast policy.
5. Broadcasting, recording, photographing, videotaping, or televising of NSAA-sponsored events shall not be permitted for commercial purposes, or for other than personal use, except with the expressed permission of the Nebraska School Activities Association.

Bands - Artificial Noisemakers –Support Items

1. Bands are permitted during Subdistrict, District, and State contests.
2. Members MUST pay regular admission for Subdistrict, District, and State contests.
3. The use of artificial noisemakers is prohibited. Megaphones are to be used by cheerleaders only. Band instruments, including drums, are not to be played at any time other than when the entire band is playing. Bands should not be permitted to play except prior to the match, at intermissions and time-outs.
4. The use of recorded music that has been approved by the host administration may be played by a host school for warm-up provided that a band is not available to play at that time during subdistrict and district tournaments. Also permitted shall be the National Anthem or as accompaniment of an authorized student dance or cheer group.
5. Teams/Fans shall not throw items into the crowd. (i.e.: sports balls, candy, etc.)
6. Due to the fact that balloons have become a distraction and are being abused as noise makers, balloons will not be allowed at NSAA sub-district, district, and state championships.

Cheerleaders and Drill Teams

1. Due to potential liability in case of injury, mounts and pyramids by cheerleaders and drill teams during the Subdistrict, District, and State tournaments are prohibited. A mount is defined as any stunt where one individual is supported above the level of the floor by another individual or individuals. The height of the mount or pyramid, or the number of people involved, has no bearing on the type of stunt performed.
2. Cheerleaders and drill team members MUST pay regular admission to Subdistrict, District, and State events.

Handicap Accessibility. Facilities must provide reasonable accommodations for special needs.

Team Entries. Entries are due Monday, October 24.

NSAA Entry forms are accessed and submitted on-line. The Athletic/Activities director will give the certified coach the login for this activity. Go to the NSAA web site (www.nsaahome.org) and click on "School Login". Enter your login and go to "View/Edit your Form" to complete your entry form (detailed instructions can be obtained from the web site). Upon completion, the form shall be submitted to the NSAA and emailed to the district director. You may make changes to this form up until the due date. After that, you will need to contact the NSAA.

Team Practice On The Tournament Floor

1. Tournament directors should prohibit teams from practicing at tournament centers between the time locations of tournaments are announced and the time the tournaments take place. (This provision would not pertain to a school that has been designated as a home site to host a district contest in which their school is to participate.)
2. This does not prohibit the continuation of scheduled matches.
3. A team is permitted on the tournament site floor prior to the scheduled warm-up time for its match for stretching and light ball handling.

Time Schedule

1. The tournament director will set the time schedule for all tournaments.
2. Once the starting time of a match or session has been set, the time shall not be changed to an earlier time unless mutual consent is received from all schools involved in that contest, session, or round of competition.

Tournament Officials and Fees

1. Only officials registered with the NSAA will be hired.
2. The following fees have been established for all subdistrict and district tournaments.
 - a. \$45.00 per match.
 - b. Mileage shall be paid at a rate of \$1.00 per mile one-way for one automobile, per set of officials. If a set of officials travels from different locations, mileage shall be paid to the official traveling the greater distance.
3. The NSAA office will hire and write contracts for all officials.
4. The director will pay the officials from the tournament receipts.

5. Line Judges shall be fair and impartial. Line judges shall avoid wearing any attire that makes reference to a school or team. Directors shall resist using parents or individuals that are affiliated with competitors on the competing teams being represented.

Tournament Roster

1. No volleyball team may use more than fourteen girls in any tournament.
2. No more than fourteen girls may be suited up for any tournament match.
3. Prior to the first match, the team's coach shall designate to the tournament director the fourteen players who are the certified team for that tournament. This shall be the tournament roster.
 - a. There shall be no substitution or addition to this certified roster except for injury or illness.
 - b. In case of a physician-verified player injury/illness, the tournament director may approve the use of more than fourteen players.
 - c. Once one of the original fourteen players has been replaced because of injury or illness, that player cannot be dressed for that tournament.
4. If a coach fails to certify the fourteen players, the 14 names entered in the official scorebook prior to the first match, which the team plays shall be the certified roster.
 - a. Substitution for the players whose names are entered in the book may be made in case of physician-verified injury/illness.
5. In case of substitution for illness or injury, the substitute must remain on the roster for the remainder of the tournament.
 - a. The original player, once substituted for, may not be returned to the original roster during that tournament.
6. On the entry form to be sent to the tournament director and the NSAA office, no more than fourteen players shall be listed.
 - a. Substitution may be made in case of illness or injury.
7. Teams which qualify for a district final in Classes C1, C2, D1, D2, or the state tournament for all classes, may make substitution in their original roster provided the students are eligible in all respects and provided the substitutions are made in the list prior to the playoff match or first match in the state tournament.

Withdrawal From The Tournament

Teams, which withdraw from a subdistrict, district, or state tournament after pairings have been made, are subject to penalty by the Board of Directors unless the Executive Director for sufficient cause authorizes such withdrawal.

Complimentary Passes

1. Participant passes for players and student manager shall not exceed 18; 2 coaches' passes shall be provided.
2. Administrative and supervisory passes.
 - a. C1, C2, D1 and D2, 6 passes per school.

Financial Arrangements

1. Officials.
2. Host school allowance--\$50.00.
3. 8% of gross receipts to NSAA for catastrophic insurance.
4. 25% gross receipts to host school.
5. 25% gross receipts to NSAA.
6. Visiting schools' expenses--mileage--\$1.70 per mile one-way.
7. Bonus.

- a. 15% to host.
- b. 10% to NSAA.
- c. 75% to participating schools.

District Finals Pairings

The pairings for the district finals are as follows and apply to the four classes--C1, C2, D1, and D2.

1. Winners of the Subdistricts shall set the sites for district finals. If the two schools involved cannot agree; the NSAA Office will select the site.
2. The winner of the odd-numbered subdistrict tournament is responsible for initiating plans for the district finals. Immediately following the conclusion of the odd-numbered subdistrict tournament, the winning school of the odd-numbered subdistrict shall contact the winner of the corresponding even-numbered subdistrict. The site, director, date, and time of the district finals shall be determined. ***As soon as these decisions are made, the NSAA office shall be notified.***

Plaques, Balls, Financial Forms, and State Tournament Report Forms

The directors of the odd-numbered subdistrict tournaments will be sent the following:

1. Championship and Runner-up Plaques.
2. Match ball for district final match.
3. District Finals financial report form.
4. Information and forms pertaining to the State Volleyball Tournament.

This material is to be given to an administrator of the school that wins the subdistrict tournament. It is their responsibility to take the material to the site of the district final match and give it to the district final director.

Designated Home Team

The winner of the odd-numbered district shall be designated as the "home" team.

Officials

1. The officials' fee shall be the same for all districts and shall be \$45.00 per match for each official plus \$1.00 per mile one-way for one car. If a set of officials travel from different locations, mileage shall be paid to the official traveling the greater distance.
2. The officials will be hired and assigned by the NSAA office.
3. The tournament director will pay their fee from the tournament receipts.

Handicap Accessibility. Facilities must provide reasonable accommodations for special needs.

Qualifying for State

Reporting

Following the final match of each district tournament, the state qualifying school shall immediately update the entry form via the NSAA login page.

Wild Card Criteria

The results of only those matches played against varsity teams of schools in Nebraska and of schools in states contiguous to Nebraska will be used to:

1. Calculate Point Averages
2. To determine the win and loss record for designating a team as a first, second, third, or fourth division team.

All matches played by a school's varsity team regardless of the location of the opposing school will count toward the number of permitted contests in a particular sport.

Qualifying for State

1. In Class A seven teams will qualify for the state tournament by winning the championship of their respective district tournaments.
2. In Classes B, C1, C2, D1 and D2 six teams will qualify for the state tournament by winning the championships of their respective district tournaments.
3. One additional team in Class A and two additional teams in Classes B, C1, C2, D1 and D2, which fail to qualify through district tournament competition, will be chosen to complete the eight-team tournament field.
4. These teams will be selected in the following manner:
 - a. Only varsity matches between varsity Nebraska teams and varsity teams from states contiguous with Nebraska will be considered when calculating the point totals.
 - b. The results of all such matches played through the district tournaments shall be used.
 - c. This includes regularly scheduled matches, tournament matches, and district matches.
 - d. The records of all schools available to the NSAA on the date of seeding shall be used to calculate wildcard averages, even though an error on the record may be discovered after the fact.
5. FORFEITS: Teams shall receive wild card points for forfeited losses if the forfeit was due to extenuating circumstances (such as weather) between the two schools. No wild card points shall be awarded for losses when the forfeit is required by the Executive Director or Board of Directors; an appeal to the Executive Director would be heard if the infraction leading to the NSAA-required forfeiture was self-reported by the school.
6. FORFEITS: When a school's varsity team is unable to complete the season, those remaining teams on that school's regular season schedule shall receive forfeit wins for those scheduled contests and shall be awarded wild card points for those forfeit wins. Wild card points will be determined by the forfeiting team's record at the time of seeding for postseason competition.
7. All contests played against the varsity teams of schools located within Nebraska and against the varsity teams of schools located in contiguous states will be used to determine the point average.
8. The following point evaluation scale will be used to determine a team's total points:

- ◆ A first division team is a team, which has won at least **75%** of its matches played.
(Examples: 20-0, 19-1, 18-2, 17-3, 16-4, 15-5.)
- ◆ A second division team is a team, which has won at least **50%** but less than **75%** of its matches played.
(Example: 14-6, 13-7, 12-8, 11-9, 10-10.)
- ◆ A third division team, which has won at least **25%** but less than **50%** of its matches played.
(Examples: 9-11, 8-12, 7-13, 6-14, 5-15.)
- ◆ A fourth division team is a team, which has won less than **25%** of its matches played.
(Examples: 4-16, 3-17, 2-18, 1-19, 0-20.)

9. No points are deducted for playing teams, which are, classified below your classification.
10. In competition with schools one classification above yours, 2 bonus points will be awarded.
11. In competition with schools two classifications above yours, 3 bonus points will be awarded.
12. In competition with schools three classifications above yours, 4 bonus points will be awarded.
13. In competition with schools four classifications above yours, 5 bonus points will be awarded.
14. A team's point rating will be determined by dividing the total number of points by the number of contests played.
15. The two teams failing to qualify through district competition in their class, but having the highest point average based on the year's record after the completion of all the district tournaments will be selected as the wild card qualifiers.

16. If a tie exists for one or both of the qualifying spots, the following procedure will be used to select the team or teams.
 - a. If only two teams have identical point averages and are tied for one of the qualifying spots and the teams have played each other, the team that won the contest or the majority of contests between the two teams in question will qualify for the state tournament.
 - b. If the two teams have not played each other or if more than two teams are tied, step C will be used to determine which team qualifies for the state tournament.
 - c. If two or more teams have identical point averages and are tied for one or both of the remaining qualifying spots, the team or teams playing the greatest number of first division teams will be selected. If only two teams remain after this step and the two teams tied have played each other, step A will be used to determine the qualifier for the state tournament.
 - d. If a tie still exists, the team's opponents' wins and losses will be totaled and the winning percentages calculated. The team whose opponents have the highest percentage based on this calculation will be chosen.
 - e. If a tie still exists, the representative will be decided by a coin flip in the NSAA office.
17. Classes C1, C2, D1 and D2 must play a minimum of **4 teams** classified at their classification or above.
18. Schools must report contiguous out-of-state records to the NSAA. Win-loss records not reported to the NSAA will be recorded as a fourth-division team until such information is provided.
19. When determining the classification of an out-of-state school for wild card purposes, if the school's three-grade enrollment is less than the lowest enrollment in a particular class, the out-of-state school shall be classified in the immediate lower class. The enrollment of Nebraska schools opting up to play in a higher class will not be considered when comparing out-of-state schools for classification purposes.
 - a. If two or more schools are tied for the final place in a particular class, the tie is broken by using the schools' three-year average enrollment for the most recent three years. When determining the classification of an out-of-state school for wild card purposes, if the out-of-state school's three-grade enrollment is identical to the enrollments shared by schools in two different classes, the out-of-state school shall be placed in the higher class.

State Volleyball Tournament

Date and Site. The Volleyball State Championship will be held in **Hastings/Grand Island** on Friday-Saturday, November 10, 11, 12.

Tournament Roster

1. Teams qualifying for the state tournament may make substitutions on their original roster provided:
 - a. The girls substituted are eligible in all respects.
 - b. The substitution is made prior to the team's first match of the tournament.
 - c. Once the tournament begins, there shall be no substitutions or additions to this list except for sickness or injury.
 - d. If the state tournament qualifiers know they will have a change in their rosters, from what was submitted on the district form, the state tournament program will be able to reflect these changes if the NSAA office is notified on or before noon, Saturday, November 5.

Bands - Artificial Noisemakers – Support Items

1. Bands are permitted during Subdistrict, District, and State contests.
2. Members **MUST** pay regular admission for Subdistrict, District, and State contests.
3. The use of artificial noisemakers is prohibited. Megaphones are to be used by cheerleaders only. Band instruments, including drums, are not to be played at any time other than when the entire band is playing. Bands should not be permitted to play except prior to the match, at intermissions and time-outs.
4. The use of recorded music that has been approved by the host administration may be played by a host school for warm-up provided that a band is not available to play at that time during subdistrict and district tournaments. Also permitted shall be the National Anthem or as accompaniment of an authorized student dance or cheer group.
5. Teams/Fans shall not throw items into the crowd. (i.e.: sports balls, candy, etc.)
6. Due to the fact that balloons have become a distraction and are being abused as noise makers, balloons will not be allowed at NSAA sub-district, district, and state championships.

Cheerleaders and Drill Teams

1. Due to potential liability in case of injury, mounts and pyramids by cheerleaders and drill teams during the Subdistrict, District, and State tournaments are prohibited. A mount is defined as any stunt where one individual is supported above the level of the floor by another individual or individuals. The height of the mount or pyramid, or the number of people involved, has no bearing on the type of stunt performed.
2. Cheerleaders and drill team members MUST pay regular admission to Subdistrict, District, and State events.

Match Ball. The official tournament ball the Baden three-color (navy/gray/white) VX5EC-213.

Lodging. Schools are responsible for their own lodging arrangements.

Officials. Officials will be assigned to each match, including scorers and timers.

Pairings

1. Seeding.
 - a. State competition shall be seeded based on wild card point averages. The most recent point average computed through and including district competition shall be the points used. The records of all schools available to the NSAA on the date of the seeding shall be used to calculate wildcards averages, even though an error on the record may be discovered after the fact.
 - b. A varsity team from a school may play a junior varsity team of any classification or a team from a state not contiguous with Nebraska and must count that contest toward the total number of permitted contests, but may not count such contest toward subdistrict, district and state competition seeding.
 - c. The No. 1 seed will play No. 8; No. 2 vs. 7; No. 3 vs. 6; and No. 4 vs. 5.
 - d. If teams in the state tournament have identical winning percentages, the following tie-breaker will be used to determine seeding:
 - 1) If two teams are tied with identical point averages and have played each other, the results of the competition between these schools will be considered and the team winning the majority of contests between the two teams tied will be given the higher seed.
 - 2) If a tie still exists, or if more than two teams are tied, the team or teams playing the greatest number of first division teams will be selected. If two teams are still tied, criteria 1) will apply before going to step 3).
 - 3) If the tie still exists, total the sum of the tied teams' opponents' wins and losses. The team whose opponents have the higher winning percentage will receive the higher seed. If two teams remain tied, criteria 1: will apply before going to step 4).
 - 4) If a tie still exists, the higher seed will be decided by a coin flip in the NSAA office.
2. Seeds are placed on the bracket using the following procedure:
 - a. There was a draw to see if Nos. 1-8 and Nos. 4-5 played in the upper half of the bracket or the lower half.
 - b. Nos. 2-7 and 3-6 were assigned to the half bracket not drawn by Nos. 1-8 and Nos. 4-5.
 - c. Matches involving the Nos. 1-2 seeded teams were assigned to times within a session, which were considered to have the best crowd appeal.
 - d. There was a draw to see if No. 1 was on the top line or the bottom line of its match bracket.
 - e. There was a draw to see if No. 4 was on the top line or the bottom line of its match bracket.
 - f. No. 5 was assigned to the line not drawn by No. 4.
 - g. There was a draw to see if No. 2 was on the top line or the bottom line of its match bracket.
 - h. No. 7 was assigned to the line not drawn by No. 2.
 - i. There was a draw to see if No. 3 was on the top line or the bottom line of its match bracket.
 - j. No. 6 was assigned to the line not drawn by No. 3.
3. On the Saturday morning prior to the state tournament, the NSAA will confirm pairings for state.

Participants' Tickets

1. Each coach will be sent passes for his players, coaches, etc., by mail.
2. Each competing team will receive 2 coaches and 18 participant's passes.
3. Two additional tickets will be placed in each packet for the administration.

Radio and Television

Broadcasting, recording, photographing, videotaping, or televising of NSAA-sponsored events shall not be permitted for commercial purposes, or for other than personal use, except with the expressed permission of the Nebraska School Activities Association.

Reimbursements To Teams

Mileage. Mileage reimbursements will be based on the number of participants (qualifiers, number on roster) and one coach. (Note: Student Managers will not be included.) A school's mileage reimbursement will be figured using the following formula: [(#miles **one way** x # trips) – 50 miles] x appropriate amount listed below:

2. Lodging. If lodging is used, \$15 per participant and one coach will be paid based on the following criteria: (Note: **Times listed are scheduled competition start times.**)

Night before competing—

Before 10:00 a.m., 76 + miles away

Between 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., 150+ miles away

At or after 3:00 p.m., 250+ miles away

Night of (still competing in State Meet)—76+ miles away

Final Night (Day eliminated) —5:00 p.m. or later, 200+ miles away

Reporting for First Contest

1. Report to the floor manager at the site of your first match.
2. The coach is to notify the floor manager as to where the team is staying during the tournament.
3. You will be given two programs prior to your contest.

Signs

1. Signs are permitted provided they are in good taste, not political, and are not derogatory.
2. Signs should be used to encourage a team, not degrade the opposition.

Spectators' Tickets

1. Individual session tickets are \$7.00 for adults and \$5.00 for students.
2. A pre-sale ticket will be available for purchase in advance for admittance at any session. Pre-sale tickets will be non-refundable and admittance is not guaranteed subject to capacity.
3. A different ticket will be used for each session, but that ticket will entitle the holder to admittance at any one of the sites.
4. If the holder enters one site during a session and then goes to another site during the same session, a new ticket will have to be purchased.
5. Tournament tickets for coaches and administrators are available. Tickets must be purchased in advance and a school is limited to ten tickets. Price of tickets is \$25.00 per ticket, plus \$1.00 postage. These tickets will give admittance to any match, any session.
6. Tickets may be purchased in advance from the NSAA office.
7. If ordering tickets by mail, please place order far enough in advance so delivery may be made prior to departure to the tournament.
8. When tickets are ordered by mail, there will be a \$1.00 handling charge per order for individual session tickets.
9. Schools, which qualify a team, may order individual session tickets on consignment.
10. The administrators and coach's tournament tickets will not be sold on consignment.
11. Consignment orders may be placed by telephone after qualifiers and time of contest has been determined.

FAN / SPECTATOR SUPPORT ITEMS VOLLEYBALL

Sportsmanlike vocal cheering and support from the team bench area are encouraged.

Regulations listed are subject to facility restrictions.

ACCEPTABLE: Banners on wall except welcome or corporate sponsor, handheld signs, megaphones (elected cheerleaders only), shirts on fans (required), team introduction run-throughs or break away banners, pompoms, shakers spirit towels, prerecorded music that has been approved by the host administration may be played during pre-contest warm-ups provided that a high school band is not available to play during that time, school bands and carried school flags (running/taunting prohibited).

UNACCEPTABLE: Balloons, confetti/shredded paper, laser light/pointer/flashing objects, artificial noise makers (included but not limited to horns, cow bells, bells, buzzers, clickers, thunder sticks, rattles, instruments not part of a band.), whistles, air horns/sirens, cannons/muskets/guns/fireworks and live animals.
